## **HOTEL & CONVENTION INFORMATION**

Novacon 54 will be returning to the Palace Hotel in Buxton in the Peak District. The hotel address is Palace Road Buxton SK17 6AG. For those who have not been before Buxton a thermal spa town, with lots of interesting buildings and places to visit for those who wish to venture outside the hotel. These include the Opera House, the Devonshire Dome (once the largest unsupported dome in the world), a restored Georgian crescent and the ornamental Pavilion Gardens. There are supermarkets nearby including Waitrose, & Sainsbury's Local. There are also plenty of cafés and restaurants, not forgetting the lovely real ale pubs. For those who have not been before the whole hotel is light and airy with high ceilings and some impressive decor. And a conservatory. It also has the longest continuous wrought-iron banister in Britain. There is a swimming pool and gym/spa facilities. The hotel has a large car park and parking is included for convention guests.



As before, all the convention rooms including Programme, Off-piste, Art show and Dealers are all on the ground floor. The bars and toilets are also on the ground floor and there is plenty of seating.

Reminder or for those who haven't been before, the hotel has a lift, but as it is an old hotel some of the rooms are on "mezzanine" levels and still involve a few steps, so if this will cause you difficulties, please let the hotel know in advance and they'll do their best to accommodate you.

At the moment the hotel policy is that due to safety concerns, they do not permit Mobility Scooters in the lift. However a new lift is due to be installed before the convention and if the policy changes we will let you know.

### **Disabled Access:**

The main entrance has a few steps. Alternatively, there is ramp access at the rear of the hotel for those with difficulty with steps. This is on the left-hand side of the hotel as you face it, near the Leisure Centre. If arriving by car, there are car parking spaces near to that entrance.

The door pictured below with the arrow next to the entrance to the bar can be used as the disabled access and takes people along the corridor rather than through the kitchen area which was the previous route.

**Food and Drink:** There is a real ale pump on the bar that currently has Deepdale gluten free ale. They will also have a variety of cans and bottles. Bottles of wine will be available at £18. Baps/Butties will be available from the Rippon bar including Sausage, Bacon, Veggie sausage or chips.

## Convention Room rates and Booking

The Room rates have, gone up this the year. Convention room rates are: £116 per night for a Standard Double or Twin room (i.e. £58 per person with two people sharing). Single rooms are £73pp. Rates include breakfast.

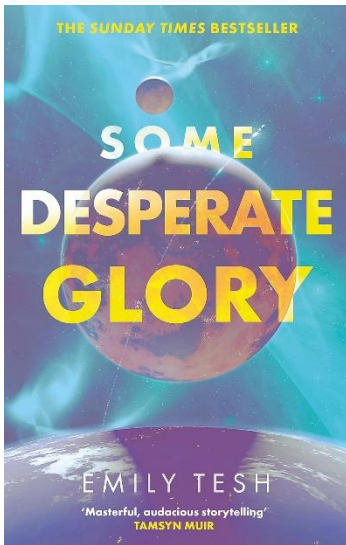
One change from previous years is that WIFI is now free throughout the hotel.

## **GUEST OF HONOUR – EMILY TESH**



We are very pleased that Emily Tesh has agreed to be our Guest of Honour for Novacon 54.

Emily is a science fiction and fantasy writer, podcaster and also a Classics teacher.

She has won the 2020 World Fantasy Award for Best Novella (SILVER IN THE WOOD), the 2021 Astounding Award for Best New Writer, and the Hugo for Best Novel in 2024 (SOME DESPERATE GLORY). She has also been shortlisted for other awards including the Arthur C Clarke Award and the Locus Award for Best First Novel in 2024 for (SOME DESPERATE GLORY). Most recently she has been announced as a finalist in this year's Hugos

(2025) for Best Fancast (*Eight Days of Diane Wynne Jones* with Rebecca Fraimow).

Her latest novel, *THE INCANDESCENT* is due to be published in May by Orbit. In contrast to the SF of *SOME DESPERATE GLORY*, this is a Dark Academia fantasy featuring Dr Walden, Director of Magic at Chetwood School, as she tries to keep her school, students and its centuries-old legacy safe from demonic incursions.

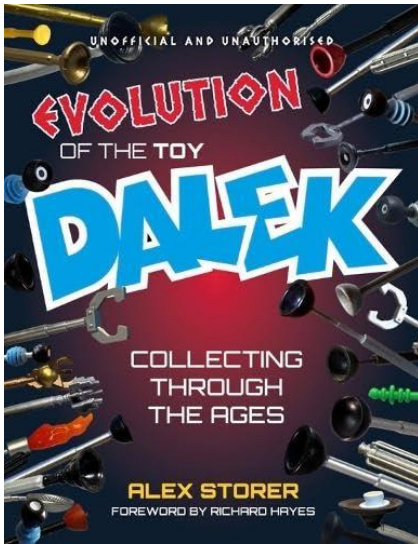

He has recently published (March 2025) a book, **EVOLUTION OF THE TOY DALEK: *Collecting Through the Ages***. It's a celebration of the toy Dalek through its many forms and releases and is clearly a labour of love. Described as the first book purely devoted to the history of toy and model Daleks from the

1960s to the present day, it includes over 600 photographs and interviews with some of the people who made it happen.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

A Convention is a private event and, as such, the Committee has always had the right and the ability to remove any attendee for antisocial behaviour. Over recent years, it has become standard practice for such events to publish a Code of Conduct providing guidelines as to what that antisocial behaviour may include.

The Code of Conduct is a living document. It evolves, intending always to reflect current best practice. The version in use at each Novacon is fixed in advance of the convention, and the version for Novacon 54 will be available on the website ([www.novacon.uk/n54/](http://www.novacon.uk/n54/)) and will be printed in the convention Programme book. It should be noted that the Code of Conduct governs not only behaviour at Novacon, but also in certain spaces elsewhere, including but not limited to activity online, such as in



messages or replies to Novacon accounts on social media, and posts in Novacon pages and groups.

The Novacon Code of Conduct team receives complete information from preceding Novacon Code of Conduct teams, and passes complete information to future Novacon Code of Conduct teams. It also maintains an awareness of activity which has been of concern to other conventions. For most people, the simple principle of, “Behave like a decent human being,” is enough of a guideline. ## **One Million Times: A Science Fiction Anthology**

As reported in last year’s Programme, previous Novacon attendees **Rogelio Fojo** and **R James Doyle** had been working on a science fiction anthology, ONE MILLION TIMES. It is described as stories themed around “Chronicles of time travellers among us”. This was published in April and features work from other previous Novacon members, including **Teika Marija Smits** and **Christopher Priest**. It also has a cover and illustrations by previous Guest of Honour **Chris Baker (Fangorn)**. It is published in the UK by **Elsewhen Press**, who have been regular members of Novacon for many years. Other contributors include David Gerrold, R C Matheson, and others.

## **DISEASE MITIGATION POLICY AT NOVACON**

It has become increasingly clear that even though things have improved since the height of the pandemic, an awareness of the

potential for the spread of infectious disease in convention spaces needs to be always considered.

- We request members to **take a lateral flow** test prior to attending convention.
- If you have any symptoms of an infectious respiratory infection, please do not attend the convention. If you take ill during the convention, please consider isolating yourself from other attendees.

Other specific measures may be announced nearer the convention, and the committee will continue to monitor things. We will keep members up to date with any other proposed restrictions.
