


Art show and Dealers are all on the ground floor. The bars and toilets are also on the ground floor and there is plenty of seating. There is ramp access at the rear of the hotel for those with difficulty with steps. Please note if you have specific requirements, don't hesitate to contact the hotel directly at 0871 221 0253.

For those of you have been to the Palace before you will be pleased to know the lift has been refurbished. It is not any faster but now remembers where it is going without having to press numerous times. Sadly they still will not allow scooters in the lift.

Convention room rates.:

- Rooms with Breakfast are: £116 per night for a Standard Double or Twin room (i.e. £58 per person with two people sharing).
- Single rooms are £73pppn.


ART SHOW

SOME DESPERATE GLORY by Emily Tesh – Reviewed by Claire Cartwright



What can I say about **SOME DESPERATE GLORY** without giving away any spoilers? This book is space opera at its finest. It richly deserved the Hugo award it won. We start by following Kyr, our main character, as she attempts a test simulation. The simulation places the cadets in a mission that would have seen them save the Earth. Outside of the test, the Earth was not saved, it was destroyed. Kyr is one of a dwindling number of humans living on Gaia station, in a militaristic society which demands that all do their part. For some, their part is combat, to defend

them from hostile alien races and take their revenge for what was done to Earth. For others, it is to produce the next generation of humans on Gaia station. The cadets are assigned their task. They do not get to choose. When Kyr's brother, the poster child of military perfection, vanishes unexpectedly, Kyr has to face up to some truths about the society she promotes and defends. A chance encounter with an alien, then a friend of her brother's she never knew about, starts to change her opinion on the military that has moulded her. We follow Kyr as she chases after her brother and finds out that the universe is much bigger and more complicated than Gaia has taught her. This is such a beautifully written story that explores some very dark themes while showing us that found family can save you from anything. Even yourself. Especially yourself.

CODE OF CONDUCT

A Convention is a private event and, as such, the Committee has always had the right and the ability to remove any attendee for antisocial behaviour. Over recent years, it has become standard

practice for such events to publish a Code of Conduct providing guidelines as to what that antisocial behaviour may include.

The Code of Conduct is a living document. It evolves, intending always to reflect current best practice. The version in use at each Novacon is fixed in advance of the convention, and the version for Novacon 54 will be available on the website (www.novacon.uk/n54/) and will be printed in the convention Programme book. It should be noted that the Code of Conduct governs not only behaviour at Novacon, but also in certain spaces elsewhere, including but not limited to activity online, such as in messages or replies to Novacon accounts on social media, and posts in Novacon pages and groups.

The Novacon Code of Conduct team receives complete information from preceding Novacon Code of Conduct teams, and passes complete information to future Novacon Code of Conduct teams. It also maintains an awareness of activity which has been of concern to other conventions. For most people, the simple principle of, "Behave like a decent human being," is enough of a guideline. 
BRIAN ALDISS OBE- 100 YEARS

August 2025 would have been the centenary of Brian Aldiss' birth Brian Aldiss OBE was a hugely respected and influential writer especially in the field of science fiction. He frequent was а attendee of early Novacons and was the Guest of Honour at Novacon 10 and 25. He was also, along




with Harry Harrison, Honorary President of the Birmingham Science Fiction Group. There will be a panel at this year's Novacon discussing his work and what he might have made of current technological changes.

For fans of science fiction who may be unaware of some of his activities, the following is a very brief summary. Although primarily known for his science fiction (novels, short stories and numerous anthologies) he also wrote poetry, plays, autobiographies and non-fiction. His first science fiction novel NON-STOP was published in



1958 (and is still available as a SF Masterwork). He was part of the "New Wave" which included writers such as J G Ballard, Michael Moorcock and Harry Harrison. Several of his books have been



adapted as films including FRANKENSTEIN UNBOUND, BROTHERS OF THE HEAD and the short story "Supertoys Last All Summer Long" (loosely adapted as the film A.I: ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE).

As well as actively writing science fiction he also was influential as an editor of many anthologies including *SF Horizons* (jointly with Harry Harrison). He has also been important in the study of science fiction with his histories of the genre, BILLION YEAR SPREE which was subsequently updated as TRILLION YEAR SPREE.

He won many awards including the Hugo (HOTHOUSE and TRILLION YEAR SPREE), Nebula (THE SALIVA TREE), BSFA (THE MOMENT OF ECLIPSE, BILLION YEAR SPREE, HELLICONIA SPRING and HELLICONIA WINTER) and the John W Campbell Award (HELLICONIA SPRING). In 2000 he was elected a Grand Master by the SFWA and inducted into the Science Fiction Hall of Fame in 2004. Outside the SF field he was awarded an honorary Doctorate of Letters from Liverpool University in 2008 and was awarded an OBE in 2005 for his services to literature.



I found it interesting that this year, Project Hyperion, a competition to design a generation spaceship announced its winners, when the concept of a generation spaceship was used in Brian's first SF novel, NON-

STOP. Thus we move from science fiction towards science fact (albeit still some years away) and it would no doubt have been insightful to have Brian's opinion. The competition was hosted by the Initiative for Interstellar Studies and there was a prize fund of \$10,000. If you are interested in learning more about Project Hyperion, then check out the links below.

For those interested in learning more about Brian and his work, Brian's papers are held at the Bodleian Library in Oxford and at a supplementary archive at the Science Fiction Collection in Liverpool. Many of his works are still available as SF Masterworks or at Gollancz Gateway. Also, HarperVoyager will publish HELLO EARTH, ARE YOU THERE in December of this year, described as a new collection of twenty-seven of his short stories. Finally, a new annual award for worldbuilding in speculative fiction has been planned. The Aldiss Award will be launched in November at the World Fantasy Convention in Brighton.

DISEASE MITIGATION POLICY AT NOVACON

It has become increasingly clear that even though things have improved since the height of the pandemic, an awareness of the potential for the spread of infectious disease in convention spaces needs to be always considered.

At this point in time, as a minimum, we would ask that:

- All attending members are **fully vaccinated** against Covid where possible.
- We request members to take a lateral flow test prior to attending convention.
- If you have any symptoms of an infectious respiratory infection, please do not attend the convention. If you take ill during the convention, please consider isolating yourself from other attendees

Other specific measures may be announced nearer the convention, and the committee will continue to monitor things. We will keep members up to date with any other proposed restrictions.
